## SPONSOR'S LETTER [Habeas Corpus, bond or parole]

### Instructions:

- This letter should be written by the person who will provide housing and support to the detained person if they are released.
- If you are requesting bond, address the letter to "Dear Immigration Judge."
- If you are requesting parole, address the letter to "Dear ICE Officer."
- Be sure to attach proof of your immigration status (for example, a copy of your green card, U.S. passport, or work authorization card) and proof of your address (such as a utility bill, lease, or official mail showing your name and address).
